A Leadership Development Program to Support Local Communities

The purpose of **Growing Leaders in Pembina County** is to provide leadership development opportunities to residents of Pembina County.

Overall Objectives

- To build confidence and leadership skills for Pembina County residents.
- To increase the number of individuals running for office or willing to serve on committees within Pembina County communities.
- To increase awareness of the assets and services available in Pembina County.



Who can be involved?

Anyone from Pembina County ages 16 and up who wants to develop their personal leadership skills, learn more about Pembina County, and work on a county-wide project that will better the region.

What is involved in the program?

Participants will attend eight(8), seven-hour sessions from 9AM to 4PM, one day each month from September 2011 to May 2012 (there will not be a session in December 2011). Each session will be held in a different community in Pembina County and involve educational programming in the morning, and a tour of the community, local businesses, and services in the afternoon. A schedule with educational program topics and sites is listed on the back of this form.

What is the cost?

Tuition is **\$200 per participant**. The tuition includes noon lunches, breaks, and materials, as well as transportation and lodging while in Bismarck in March 2012. Scholarships may be available for individuals and please contact Lynette or Carol below if needed.
