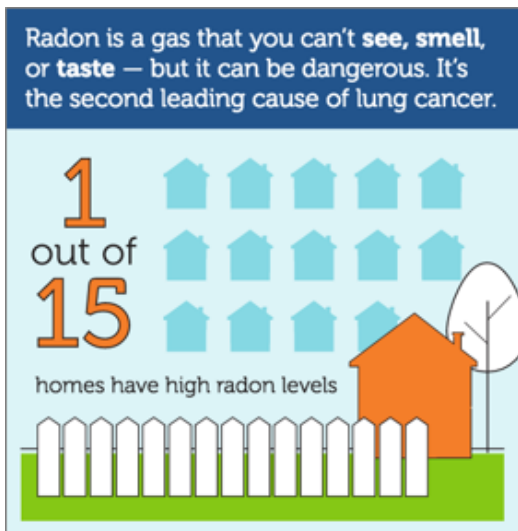

Radon Information Sheet



Radon is the number two cause of lung cancer in the United States. It is a colorless, odorless, radioactive gas. It forms naturally from the decay (breaking down) of radioactive elements, such as uranium, which are found in soil and rock throughout the world. It is estimated to cause over 20,000 lung cancer deaths each year in the U.S., and 1 out of 15 homes have dangerously high radon levels.¹



Pembina County 2012 to 2018 data provided by Alpha Energy Labs shows 66 homes were tested for radon. Of those, 55 or 83% are at or above the "Action Level" of 4.0 picocuries per liter (pCi/L).²

In North Dakota, 63 percent of homes have an elevated level of radon above the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) 'Action Level' of 4.0 picocuries per liter (pCi/L).³

Testing your home is the only way to find out if you have a radon problem.

Good News! Pembina County Public Health has FREE radon kits available for you to test your home! The laboratory fees and postage are included with the kit. Test results are sent directly to the contact.
