

Pembina County Public Health provided a self-service display at the Pembina County Fair held July 7-9, 2021 in Hamilton. Free products available included:

- Deterra bags for disposing of unused medications at home with normal garbage disposal.
- Drug Safety booklets including tobacco/vaping information, alcohol, drug use and support information.
- Rural Safety booklets discussing farm and recreational activities, first aid, and keeping kids safe.
- Health Safety booklets covering healthy lifestyles, environments and information for parents.
- Radon test kits free to those who want to test their home for radon levels.
- Grilling safety tips when using charcoal and propane grills.
- Gas and fire safety including a fire starter stick as an alternative method to enjoy a crackling fire.
- Driveway safety tips to limit play and watch for children around parked and moving cars.

Nurses were available on July 7th allowing fair attendees an opportunity to receive COVID vaccines.



The Pembina County Public Health nurses are on the move again bringing flu and Covid vaccines to our local communities! School vision testing and immunizations have been scheduled with school administration. Immunizations can also be scheduled at the outreach locations or by an office appointment.

"If young people don't start using tobacco by age 26, they almost certainly will never start."

More than half of North Dakota high schoolers have used an electronic nicotine product and **1 in 12 report every day use.** It's a concerning statistic, but one we can fix with sound policy and promoting resources.

Over half of North Dakota high schoolers have tried a vaping product and one in twelve use an ENDS product daily. North Dakota's response to address cessation in this age group is detailed on <u>page 32</u> and in the annual <u>quitline</u> report (under separate cover).

> Tobacco costs the state \$326 million in smoking-related costs, likely more since ENDSrelated costs are not captured. Only a fraction is recuperated through taxes.

With absence of regulations of ENDS products, there is no way to capture the true cost of nicotine addiction to North Dakotans. The Pembina County Behavioral Health Coalition and the Pembina County Memorial Hospital Foundation presented a special screening of **Suicide The Ripple Effect** at the Walla Theater in Walhalla on September 15, 2021. The showing drew in about 100 attendees from junior high students to elders. Local newspapers published the articles and advertising to inform the public of the event on a subject that has rocked our communities lately.

Local resources were available to enlighten attendees on what and where help is available in our communities. They explained how they can help during a crisis, when overcome by feelings of loneliness or despair. The biggest message was to ask someone if they are planning on committing suicide and/or if they have a plan to carry it out. A strong message was to take time to ask a distraught person "How are you to-day?" or just say, "Hello". It might just save their life by allowing the person time to rethink their situation.
